Program Nursing: Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

The FAMU MSN program prepares students through their online and face-to-face programs to practice in a field with professional licensure or certification available.

Specific licensure and certification requirements vary by state¹. State requirements typically include earning a degree or other educational credential in the field from an institution and program that meet certain eligibility requirements in that state (e.g., curricular requirements, accredited status, approval by the state licensing board); passing a state or national exam; working in the field for a minimum period of time; and/or completing a certain number of clinical hours. FAMU Program Preparation in the State of Florida

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) license is a requirement to enroll in the MSN program. The MSN program at FAMU leads to additional licensure and certification in Florida. The program is nationally accredited by the Accreditation Commission of Education in Nursing (ACEN).

Students who are graduated from the advance practice MSN programs at FAMU meet the educational eligibility criteria for taking the national board certification examination and obtaining license to practice as Advanced Registered Practice Nurse (APRN) in Florida.

This communication addresses disclosures to prospective and current students as required by FAMU's membership in the National Council's State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement and those set forth in 34§C.F.R. 668.43.

The Registrar's Office at FAMU will first verify and confirm all degree requirements have been satisfied. Then, FAMU School of Nursing will provide a validation of education where required for candidates to qualify to take the national board certification examination.
